



## Guinness Storehouse, Dublin

The Storehouse building was constructed between 1902 and 1904 and was built by Arthur Guinness Son & Ltd Co for use as a fermentation house. Fermentation is the last stage of the brewing process where the final ingredient yeast is added to the mixture of barley, water, hops and allowed to ferment. The storehouse building is 125 feet high, 170 feet long and 151 feet wide.

In October 1997 plans were accepted to develop the storehouse building into a visitor centre, incorporating a flagship Retail Store, the Company Archive and a corporate events, conference and meeting venue. The Visitor experience took 4 years to create and was opened as Guinness Storehouse the Home of Guinness, in December 2000.
